

Recruitment for an NCMD Trustee.

The is a voluntary role with a 3 year term. (expenses are paid)

The role of the Board of Trustees is to oversee the finances and financial transactions of the NCMD, to ensure that the NCMD Constitution is being adhered to at all times, and to ensure that the NCMD Committee and it's Officers are acting in the best interests of our members and the hobby at all times.

We welcome applications from anyone that meets the following criterion.

- ✓ Has been a member of the NCMD for at least 2 years.
- ✓ Is, or has been, a metal detectorist.
- ✓ Is keen to work on behalf of our members, and to represent the hobby as a whole.
- ✓ Is happy to promote responsible detecting, the recording of finds and the reporting of treasure items.
- ✓ Is computer savvy: must be familiar with using Teams, Zoom, Outlook and Word.
- ✓ Is able to attend a monthly online meeting - held in the evening for around 1 hour.
- ✓ Is able to attend the AGM, held centrally in the UK over a weekend in mid to late June.
- ✓ Has the experience and confidence to own allocated tasks and actions in order to bring them to a conclusion.
- ✓ Can work as part of a team and debate an opinion or topic with objectivity and sound judgement.
- ✓ Ideally, you will have a professional background with some relevant experience in the role of trustee or similar, be it work or hobby based.
- ✓ To become a Trustee you must meet the legal eligibility requirements, including not being disqualified due to bankruptcy, certain criminal offences, or other legal restrictions.

If you would like to be considered for a position on the NCMD Board of Trustees, please create a brief cv that is relevant to the hobby and the role, mentioning anything that you feel might benefit the organisation and our members.
